		The shamrock on the main poppy was patinated	
		to give a multitude of greens to represent Ireland.	
		The Red poppies are patinated with red oxide	
		and not painted.	
		The badges of the fifteen Irish Regiments were	
		invested on the bezel as a unit and not inserted	
		individually.	
		The plaque has both Irish and English inscriptions	
		to indicate the unique historical bond between	
		our two countries and to remind the onlooker	
		that a common culture runs through our history.	
		The patination on the main plaque represents the	
		horror of war. It gives a bombardment	
		impression of a dawn or dusk offensive. Again,	
		there is a subtle number of green shades all with	
		the intention of the representation of Ireland.	
		The bottom section has been patinated with a	
		barbed wire effect to depict an 'over the top'	
		representation.	
		To this end I wanted to give the following. The	
		homeland of these men was predominately	
		agricultural with very little industry. These men	
		would have been in daily contact with the green	
		fields of Ireland and I assumed this factor would	
		be embellished in their memories.	
		To this end, as they advanced over the top what	
		statement can sum up the courage of these	
		gallant Irishmen.
