John Toomey (Artist)</i> Created to commemorate the thirty-five thousand Irish soldiers from the Island of Ireland who made the supreme sacrifice during the first world war. This number is taken from records at The Imperial War Museum. I am given to understand it could be nearer fifty thousand men. Both the top poppy wreath and the plaque underneath have pieces of battlefield relics inserted into the silica bronze. An Irish cap badge, belt buckle and shell casing from the first battle of Ypres and Mouse Trap Farm.	SW Pillar in South Transept

		<p>The shamrock on the main poppy was patinated to give a multitude of greens to represent Ireland. The Red poppies are patinated with red oxide and not painted.</p> <p>The badges of the fifteen Irish Regiments were invested on the bezel as a unit and not inserted individually.</p> <p>The plaque has both Irish and English inscriptions to indicate the unique historical bond between our two countries and to remind the onlooker that a common culture runs through our history. The patination on the main plaque represents the horror of war. It gives a bombardment impression of a dawn or dusk offensive. Again, there is a subtle number of green shades all with the intention of the representation of Ireland. The bottom section has been patinated with a barbed wire effect to depict an 'over the top' representation.</p> <p>To this end I wanted to give the following. The homeland of these men was predominately agricultural with very little industry.
